





Q3 How useful was the content of this CE program for your practice or other professional development





Q4 After completing this CE program, I am able to describe three categories of clinical technique with survivors.





Q5 After completing this CE program, I am able to identify at least five common themes in the impact of suicide on survivors.







Q7 After completing this CE program, I am able to list tasks of psychological re-integration after suicide.













Q12 The instructional materials enhanced the content of the course.





Q13 Please rate John Jordan's knowledge of the subject matter.





Q14 Please rate the effectiveness of John Jordan's training/delivery style.





Q15 Please rate the effectiveness of John Jordan's use of technology.




